UK Debaters Win Tourney

University of Kentucky debaters captured the first-place trophy Saturday at the Marietta (Ohio) College Invitational Tournament.

Jim Flegle, Bardwell, and Jefferson Lankford, Louisville defeated Ohio University in the final round for the top honor.

Top speaker awards were presented to Lankford and Howell Hopson of Cadiz, who won first and second place trophies in the varsity division, and Mike Thomas of Madisonville, who won the third place trophy in the junior division.

Hopson and his partner, Karl Merchant, Barbourville, also were awarded a tournament trophy for reaching the quarter-finals in the varsity division.

In winning the championship, Flegle and Lankford won five of their six preliminary-round debates, and emerged as the top seated team in their division. They won their quarter-final match in a 3-0 decision over Capital University, and in the semifinals they won another 3-0 decision over West Virginia University.

Other UK debaters participating were Arch Moberly, Joe Preston and Ben Whaley.

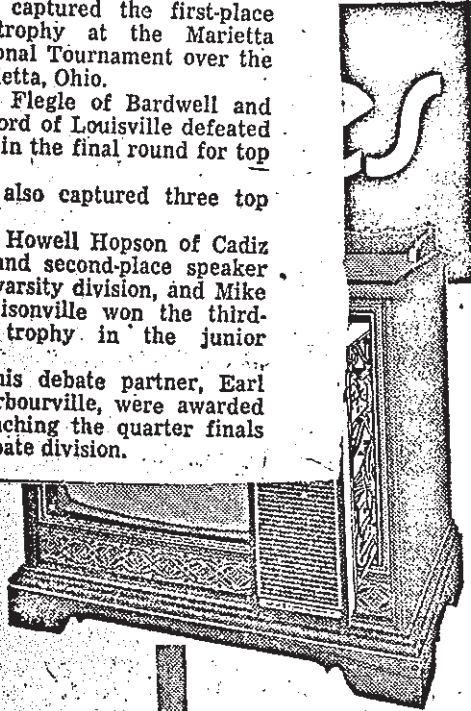
