

STUDENT AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

COLLEGE OF COMMUNICATION AND INFORMATION



The primary purpose of the Student Ambassador Program shall be to promote pride in and increase understanding of the College of Communication and Information. This program is designed to be a significant public relations program for the entire college.

The Ambassador Program shall be comprised of undergraduate students majoring in the College of Communication and Information.

Ambassador Duties will include but are not limited to:

1. Working up to two hours per week in the college recruitment office or for other recruitment events.
2. Participating in open-house and orientation sessions at the beginning of the fall and spring semesters.
3. Participating in Preview Nights, Merit Days, Come See Blue For Yourself events, college fairs, and other recruitment/college events as needed.
4. Hosting prospective students in classes and for personal visits.

To be eligible to serve as a College Ambassador a student must:

1. Be a full-time undergraduate student who has completed a minimum of 30 hours in the college by the end of Spring 2018.
2. Have earned a cumulative GPA of a 3.0 or above.
3. Have some extracurricular activity or leadership experience on campus.
4. Be available to attend mandatory meetings throughout the academic year.

The selection shall be based on:

1. Ability to communicate well, both verbally and in writing.
2. Willingness to learn about the College of Communication and Information major programs, student programs and services, faculty, staff, and alumni.
3. Enthusiasm and a positive attitude about the college and the university.
4. Willingness to devote the time and energy to fulfill the demands of the program.

Application Requirements:

Applications are due in the Student Services Center (107 Grehan Building) of the College of Communication and Information by 5:00 p.m. on **March 23, 2018.**

Applications must include one letter of recommendation (see form below) from faculty or staff within the college who is familiar with your extracurricular activities, your work ethic, and your ability to communicate competently in a variety of contexts.

For their contributions to the college, ambassadors will receive an academic scholarship each semester.
