CIS 110: Composition & Communication I
2015, 2016, and 2017; Spring of 2015

Fall of 2011, 2012, 2013,

Course Description: This integrated composition and communication course is the first in a sequence of two courses that focus on developing student's abilities to communicate ideas effectively using written, oral, visual, and electronic forms.

CIS 111: Composition & Communication II
2015, and 2016

Spring of 2012, 2013, 2014,

Course Description: This integrated composition and communication course is the second in a sequence of two courses that focus on developing student's abilities to communicate ideas effectively using written, oral, visual, and electronic forms.

CIS 112: Composition & Communication I

Fall of 2013 and 2014

Course Description: This is an accelerated version of the standard two-semester composition and communication sequence. It focuses on integrated oral, written, and visual communication skill development and emphasizes critical inquiry and research.

CIS 300: Strategic Business and Professional Communication

Fall of 2018, 2019, and 2020;

Spring of 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, and 2020; Summer of 2018, 2019, and 2020 (8-week online)

Course Description: This communication intensive course prepares students for their careers by developing effective communication skills (integrated written, oral, and visual) applied specifically to today's technology-driven and global business environment.

ICT 200: Information Literacy & Critical Thinking
Spring of 2018

Fall of 2017 and 2018;

Course Description: Emphasizing critical inquiry and critical thinking, this course will explore the theories and definitions surrounding the term "information literacy." Students will put this theory into practice by developing problem-solving skills that allow them to meet information needs throughout their lifetimes. Students will gain a better understanding of how information

and knowledge function in society and will discover methods of finding, accessing, evaluating, and using different information sources in an effective and ethical manner.

JOU 204: Writing for Mass Media Fall of 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016; Spring of 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017

Course Description: An introduction to the concepts and techniques of media writing. This course offers hands-on instruction in information gathering, organization, and writing for print, broadcast and on-line media.
