Debaters win tourney during holiday break

After two impressive performances at California tournaments over the holidays, UK's top debate team, juniors Paul Skiermont and Jason Patil, think they are the best team in the country.

UK's national championship hopes received a boost when the two won the Redlands College Invitational Tournament in December. Only a few days earlier, Skiermont and Patil were in the semifinals of the University of Southern California Tournament.

Skiermont was the top individual debater at both tournaments. He has won the top speaker's award at five of the six tournaments in which he has competed this year.

By beating Texas in the final round of the Redlands tournament, UK's top team not only avenged a semifinal loss to the same team at USC, but also convinced many that they deserve the Copland award, which is presented to the National Debate Tournament's top seed.
